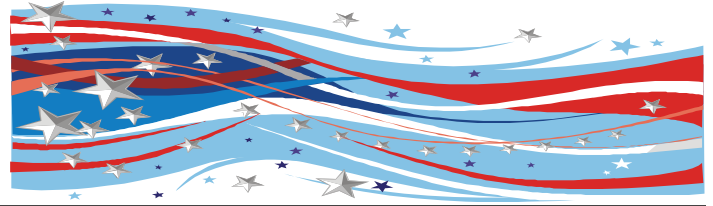

PUBLIC NOTICE

Outdoor Fires

Commercially manufactured outdoor fireplaces (i.e. fireplaces not homemade) may be used provided the following requirements are met: a. The fireplace may be used only when the fire danger index is lower than “extreme”. b. The fireplace shall be used in a safe manner and in accordance with all manufacturers’ recommendations. c. The fireplace shall have a burn pan, lid, and a fire screen surrounding the entirety of the fireplace, and the fireplace shall be at least ten (10) feet away from combustible materials. d. Only wood shall be burned in the fireplace and such wood must be dry, unpainted, unvarnished and untreated, and no leaves, paper or trash shall be burned. e. The fire shall be continually attended by a person who has readily available an approved fire extinguisher or a hose connected to a water supply, and no fireplace shall be left unattended until the fire is completely extinguished. Any outdoor fire or burning permitted, caused, maintained or used contrary to the provisions of this section constitutes a hazard and detriment to public health and safety and is declared to be a public nuisance.

The City of Lincoln is in the process of changing water meter heads. We are replacing them with a new updated radio meter head. We started the process last fall on the North Side of town and are working on completing the change out this summer and early fall. The work is being done evenings. If the City Public Works department contacts you to change your meter head you must let them in your home. After repeated attempts by phone, personal or mail contacts if they are unable to get in touch with you; your water will be disconnected until you let them in to change the head.
