City Council meetings are held the 1st Thursday after the 1st Tuesday of each month at 7:00pm at the Lincoln City Hall located at 74 Santee Road.

Planning and Zoning meetings are held the 1st Tuesday of the month at 7:00pm at the Lincoln City Hall.

Building Permits

Contact the City Building inspector at 391-5804 prior to any construction activity in your home or yard. Permits are necessary for any change or addition, repair, improvement, removal or conversion to your home or property.

Garbage, Grass Dump, and Recycling

Garbage day is Wednesday. Garbage must be bagged, tied and placed on the street in front of your home in the container provided by Waste Management by **6:00am**. Grass, leaves, and trees must be recycled in the containers on the corner of Lincoln Road and 66th Street within the fenced area. A recycle container is located by the maintenance department- the bins are for corrugated cardboard, aluminum, tin, and newspaper.

Water Billing

Meters are read on the outside of each home at the beginning of each month. The water bills are sent out by the 15th of each month and are due by the 25th of each month. If water is turned off, a \$50.00 reconnect fee and total bill due will have to be paid before water is turned back on. **Turn on of water services will only be done during office hours.**

There is a \$50.00 nonrefundable utility hook up fee. The monthly rates are: Water Flat \$21.00 plus \$3.50 per 1,000 gallons; Sewer \$10.00; Garbage \$14.80; Street Light \$1.75. A drop box is located on the outside of the city hall building where payments may be dropped off.



Animal Licenses



A license is required for all **dogs and cats** over the age of six months. These licenses need to be renewed yearly. It shall be unlawful for any person to keep or harbor more than a total of three dogs or cats, four months of age or older at any one residential location. A fee of \$10.00 for all non-spayed/non-neutered pets or a fee of \$5.00 for all spayed/neutered. A rabies vaccination record must be provided in order to purchase a license.

Fees for Impoundment:

Once an animal is impounded, an additional fee of \$10.00 will be charged for each day, or fraction thereof, of impoundment of feeding and care of animal. Impoundment will only be for 3 days. All fees must be paid to the city office before release from the pound.

Prohibited Dogs:

City of Lincoln Ordinance 6-04-01 states: As used in this section, "prohibited dog" means any dog of the breed known as American Pit Bull Terrier, as described or registered by the American Dog Breeders Association, American Pit Bull Terrier, as described or registered by the American Dog Breeders Association, or any dog that is not registered with the American Kennel Club or the United Kennel Club, of the breeds known as bull terrier, Staffordshire bull terrier, or American Staffordshire; any dog of the breed known as Rottweiler, as described or registered by the American Breeders Association; or any dog of mixed breed including one or more of the above breeds.

Lawn Establishment

5-04-04 Lawn Establishment. Seeding or other acceptable ground cover is required by new residents in front, rear, and side yards provided that adequate cover is provided within one (1) year to prevent erosion or disruption. New residents the year starts upon Water Connection Application. Current residents owning property within the City should have one year from letter of warning, which will be sent certified mail.

5-04-07 Cost Assessed to Property. When the City has effected the removal or establishment or has paid for removal or establishment, the actual cost thereof, if not paid by said owner prior thereto, shall be charged and assessed against the property upon which the compliance took place. An assessment list showing the lots or tracts to be assessed with the cost against each lot or tract shall be prepared as are other special assessment lists, and shall be approved by the City Council. Such assessments shall be subject to the same procedure for certification to the County Auditor, payment and collection as are other special assessments under State law.

48 Hour Parking

Vehicles, boat, snowmobile, bumper pull travel trailer, fifth wheel trailer, pull type camper, pickup camper, motor home, bus, mini motor home, or trailer parked on the city streets for more than 48 hours can be ticketed and are subject to being towed per ordinance regulations.

Snow Removal Policy

Removal is done during heavy periods of snowfall and clean up is done at a later time. Any vehicle left on city streets during any snow cleaning operation will be plowed around and subject to ordinance pertaining to the vehicle parking restriction. A violation occurs if snow is thrown, blown or pushed onto the street from the driveway or property.

Busing

The Bismarck School District provides school busing for the residents in Lincoln to Dorothy Moses for those who live West of Stanley Drive; and Will Moore Grade School for those who live East of Stanley Drive and North of Lincoln Road, and also Wachter Middle School and Bismarck High.
