FIREWORKS



Use of Fireworks Within the City Limits. The use of fireworks within the corporate limits of the City shall be allowed only from July 1 through July 5 of each year. Time of use shall be limited to between the hours of 12:00 p.m. until 10:00 p.m. on July 1, 2, 3 and 5 and from 12:00 p.m. until 1:00 a.m. on July 4. Violation of any of the above times could result in a fine up to \$1000.

The City of Lincoln's Partnership for Trees Planting Program is a way for homeowners to get paid to plant trees in the boulevard! This program offers direct 50%

reimbursement, up to \$75 annually to citizens and businesses who plant approved trees in the boulevard. What is a boulevard? It's the first 5 or so feet into your yard from the city street curb. Lining our streets with beautiful trees improves neighborhood appeal, attracts wildlife, provides shade and helps purify the air we breathe. If you'd like to learn more please call or stop by the City office to request an application permit or go to the city's website to print an application permit. On the website it's located in Departments>Forestry>Partnership for Trees Permit to Plant on Boulevard. PLEASE complete the permit and return it to the City office prior to planting so a Tree Board member can work with you and approve your project for reimbursement. There is also a list of approved boulevard tree species on the website to help narrow down what to plant.
